Middle School Drama Club

Middle School students are able to join this after-school activity, which runs throughout the year on a Wednesday afternoon from 3.45pm - 5.15pm in the Drama Suite.

This activity is taken by Mr. Ashton Brown, with additional tutors if numbers require.

Students learn team dynamics, communication skills and problem-solving through a vast array of physical drama activities, which not only benefit them in their Drama lessons but as important life skills.

Students in Semester Two work towards a final showing or production in Term 4.

Terms, Conditions and Information

Itinerant drama lessons are delivered by skilled teachers who are appointed by the Head of Drama. Families are billed directly by the itinerant teacher (not the College). The College is responsible for the provision of the teaching space, assisting in timetabling of lessons and providing administrative support to both the teachers, students and parents.

Itinerant teachers bill for lessons at the start of the term and are encouraged to do so before term starts. Invoices are to be paid within 7 days.

In a case where both an invoice and a reminder have been sent and payment not received, lessons will be suspended until payment is received.

Lesson absence and credits

In the case of student sickness or a College-run event clashing with a lesson, a teacher will offer a 'catch-up' lesson or credit in the following cases:

The student is sick and the teacher has been contacted by 8:30am on the day of the lesson.

The student is involved in a College activity and the teacher is notified by 8:30pm the previous evening.

Teachers are only obliged to offer 'catch-up' lessons or credits twice each term, even if further absences are justified under the terms of these conditions.

Lessons occur at the same time each week but the College timetable rotates over seven days. Thus, a student does not miss the same school subject each week. It is the student's responsibility to make up missed class work.

Beginners require a 30-minute lesson weekly.

THREE WEEKS' NOTICE (excluding holidays) is required if lessons are going to be permanently cancelled.

Fees and conditions are set by the College Drama Department. Lessons will be billed on a per term basis at **\$66 per hour**. Some teachers are GST registered and will charge 15% on top of these fees.
