Staff are expected to have the highest expectations for each student in all aspects of their education.


Teachers will be highly qualified in the knowledge, skills and teaching pedagogy of their areas of expertise.




overnance of the schools will be true to the mission and traditions of Saint Kentigern and will bring to decisions a wide diversity of professional expertise.

How Our Success Will Be Measured

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Curriculum



Saint Kentigern will provide a relevant and current curriculum from preschool to Year 13.

The curriculum will be coordinated to ensure there is a coherent pathway of skills and knowledge.

At the end of Year 11, students will have a choice of qualifications within which they can select from a wide range of subjects.

All students will be given opportunities to be globally connected



- Standardised assessments will be developed and used consistently across the Organisation at Years 2, 4, 6, 8 and 10 in English, Maths, Science and Information Technology. These will provide a benchmark against national curriculum standards
- 2. We will be the number one Decile 10 coeducational school in New Zealand in all areas of achievement in NCEA
- 3. 20% of Saint Kentigern students, will, by the end of Year 13, have gained an NZQA Scholarship

- 4. 25% of IB Diploma students will gain over 40 points and IB Diploma results will be above the world average in all subjects
- 5. Saint Kentigern graduates will enter their tertiary course and/or occupation of choice. We will encourage and assist those students who wish to attend International Universities
- Saint Kentigern schools will develop partnerships with five leading schools outside New Zealand

Approach to Teaching

Teachers will be highly qualified in their skills and knowledge of, and the teaching methods of their areas of expertise.


They will inspire in students a joy for learning and have the highest expectations of what each student can achieve.

Throughout their learning experiences students are prepared for life by being taught the value of service to others, hard work, resilience and compassion. They will gain the ability to apply knowledge and skills to real life situations.



- 1. All teaching staff will be required to critically examine at least two professional readings per term provided by the One Organisation Pedagogical team. Reflections will be shared and discussed at staff forums
- All teaching staff will be required to complete a minimum of three classroom observations per year using the template provided that identifies the purpose for each observation. Observations must include own department, different department and another school
- All departments will conduct a student voice survey annually. Staff will analyse data and share evidence with their appraiser. Trends will be considered/implemented when developing Teaching and Learning Goals

- All staff will provide evidence of pedagogical reflection, improvement and development through the appraisal process as led by the One Organisation Pedagogical team
- All Department schemes or teacher plans will have evidence of differentiation, collaboration, creativity, problem solving, critical thinking, communication and allow for student contribution







Staff



Saint Kentigern will employ only high quality, well qualified teaching and non-teaching staff.

All staff will receive regular constructive feedback on their performance and be provided with the opportunity to develop their expertise to the highest level.

A culture of commitment to the Saint Kentigern Mission, Vision and Values and a spirit of collegiality will underpin all staff relationships. Saint Kentigern will assist staff who wish to expand their careers.

Saint Kentigern staff will be recognised as leaders in their areas of expertise.



How Our Success Will Be Measured

- The Organisation will become recognised as an employer of choice, such that we receive at least five well qualified applicants for each vacancy
- All staff will receive a detailed and professional annual appraisal of their work, designed to assist them in growing professionally

Care and Wellbeing



Saint Kentigern is committed to the well-being and hauora of every student and staff member.

We prioritise the importance of creating respectful relationships with open, honest communication underpinning effective teaching and learning.

We will provide safe, nurturing learning environments. Our programmes will promote personal excellence, resilience, collaboration and independence. Every student will have a strong sense of belonging and pride in Saint Kentigern, enhanced by strong transition programmes which value the uniqueness of individual students.



- Every student, transitioning through the Saint Kentigern schools, will have all relevant educational records of their educational learning and progress passed on and utilised to benefit to the student
- Well-being surveys, with sample groups made up of both staff and students, will be conducted every two years. Results will be analysed and action plans developed
- Every student will have a classroom teacher/tutor teacher designated to be the significant adult for them at the school
- Every student will have access to timely, expert and personal support to assist them in dealing with personal issues they may encounter

- 5. Staff will hold current First Aid certificates to the ratio of 80% of Sports and PE staff, 50% teaching staff
- Saint Kentigern will have a 'best in class'
 Health & safety programme and all staff will
 receive regular training
- Each school will achieve an independent, compliant biennial Health and Safety audit
- 8. Practices that promote good mental and physical well-being will be actively promoted across the Organisation







Community Engagement

- 1. Parent enquires will be acknowledged to within one working day of being received

- The number of parents accessing information from the OLE will average 6,000 per month
- 4. Parents, Friends, Old Collegians, students and staff will access the Organisations Facebook page to a level of 25,000 per month

Saint Kentigern is committed to applying best governance and management practice to its business affairs.

All business decisions will be grounded in our Mission Statement. We will operate in a safe, ethical, informed, effective and efficient manner.

The Strategic Direction will focus effort and resource in a manner that ensures prosperity and sustainability of the 'One Organisation' and each of its individual entities.

We will apply a disciplined approach to financial management, asset management and proactive risk management and will ensure that it is compliant in all aspects of its operations.





- The KPI's, Business Strategy, Asset Management and Facilities Plans will be reviewed annually by the Board and progress communicated to stakeholders
- Each year an operating surplus will be achieved to the level that is adequate to support planned strategic initiatives and to assist with funding future infrastructural developments as outlined in the Master Plan
- Investments, Donations, Development Funds and Sponsorship will contribute 5% of the Organisation's revenue

- 4. The Organisation will achieve an unqualified Financial Audit Report annually
- Each campus will hold a current Building WOF and necessary compliance systems will be in place and training undertaken
- 6. Each school will operate a waiting list of students wishing to attend that is at least 10% of the actual intake

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Co-curricular

Saint Kentigern is committed to provide a diverse co-curricular programme, which engages all students in a meaningful way, to enhance their experience and enable them to contribute to the schools and to gain a sense of belonging and pride.





- 100% of students to participate and contribute to the schools co-curricular programmes
- 2. Opportunities will be provided for a student to participate in a major sporting code
- Each sports team representing Saint Kentigern schools will have a Coach and Manager drawn from the Saint Kentigern community
- 4. Every student who demonstrates the ability and attitude to excel at the highest level in their chosen co-curricular activity, will have the opportunity to access specialised targeted coaching and support

- 5. All students will have the opportunity to participate in a diverse range of Performing Arts groups
- 5. Each Saint Kentigern school will, over the course of a year, offer over 15 clubs or special interest programmes or events that develop student's areas of passion, strengths or expertise

Staying Connected

The Saint Kentigern Trust Board and Senior Leadership are committed to understanding and responding to the views of our Stakeholders.

- **1.** A comprehensive Parent Survey that will be carried out every two years
- **2.** Every alternate year, we will undertake a survey of students and a survey of staff
